Reporter <u>Jeff Stein</u> quotes Benjamin Sachs, a labor law expert at Harvard University: "This last term was horrendous for workers. If you are to have imagined a nightmare scenario for workers and workers rights, this would be it. But in those cases, the ruling justices also planted seeds that could lead to further damage against workers."
