Apple's Angry Response to the Department of Justice: A 'Cheap Shot' That's 'Intended to Smear the Other Side'



The U.S. Department of Justice filed a legal response on Thursday to Apple's refusal to help the FBI unlock an iPhone used by one of the San Bernardino shooters, and Apple quickly responded, with general counsel Bruce Sewell delivering a tense and angry response in a conference call with reporters, reports

Sewell called the DOJ response a "cheap shot" and said that its tone "reads like an indictment."
