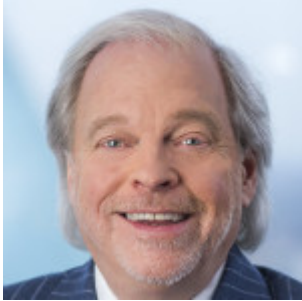


# Dallas Attorney Rogge Dunn Launches New Firm
