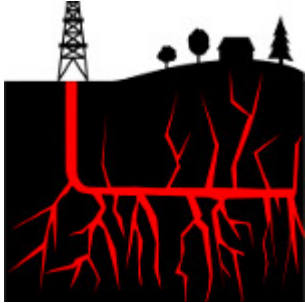


The Law of Hydraulic Fracturing
